Streets will be allocated on a first-come, first-served basis.

Residents of Kings Barton - and any other volunteers who fancy visiting our newest community - are urged to come along to the noticeboard on Manley Road at 10am where Chair of the Residents' Association Caterina Zucca will be handing out the litter-pickers and high-vis jackets. In both cases children are encouraged to help, but must be closely supervised by a responsible adult.

St Swithun's Church Open Morning 7th March

The illustration (right) shows an aerial landscape view, with the church on the right hand side of the picture. The proposal for a new car park at St Swithun's was given planning permission at a meeting of the City Council's Planning Committee last year. There will be space for 25 cars and the site will be permeable and fully landscaped. A footpath will take worshippers and visitors to the church over the existing bridge and across the churchyard to the entrance.



Flooding - latest from the Environment Agency

Following 6 consecutive months of above average rainfall, groundwater levels remain high. We would like all communities to remain prepared for groundwater flood impacts over the next few weeks.

Actions and Advice

1. Keep an eye on the latest rainfall and groundwater levels on our website <https://sites.google.com/view/groundwatergraphs>
2. Property owners should think about what you'll do if flooding occurs where you live, don't wait until flooding happens. We have a leaflet

offering practical advice to help you reduce the impact of flooding from groundwater.

3. We offer a Groundwater Flood Alert service for your location. If you want to receive Groundwater Flood Alerts then please ensure you register and that you keep your contact details up to date. Flytipping - what a disgrace!

Fly-tipping is the illegal dumping of waste, and can result in a fine of up to £50,000 in addition to a prison sentence. Residents will have noticed more incidents of flytipping recently, with the most recent occurring on School Lane at around 5pm on Sunday. If you see someone fly-tipping or discover fly-tipped waste on public land, please report it to Winchester City Council on 0300 300 0013. Don't touch it as it may be hazardous, and there may be evidence that could lead to a prosecution.

Kings Barton Play Area Opening 4th April



The play area at Kings Barton will be officially opened on Saturday 4th April at 2pm by the Deputy Mayor of Winchester, Cllr Patrick Cunningham. Please do join Parish Councillors, members of the Residents' Association and representatives from Cala to celebrate this special day at the start of the Easter holidays. There will be suitable refreshments and treats for the children. The play area is located at the end of Phase 1b, just

on the left before the new school buildings at the far end of Winchester Avenue.

Register to use County Recycling Centres

Hampshire County Council Recycling Centres (HWRC) will be charging non-Hampshire residents to use the facilities from later this year. In order to do this a new permit system will operate and will be controlled by automatic number plate recognition (ANPR) which will ensure continued free access for Hampshire residents to any of Hampshire's 24 HWRCs to dispose of household waste, while non-Hampshire residents will be charged a fee of £5 per visit.

Charges for non-household waste, including soil and rubble, plasterboard and asbestos remain. Hampshire residents can register up to three vehicles via the Hampshire County Council website. Hampshire residents, including those who live in Southampton and Portsmouth, will be able to register for free access to any Hampshire HWRC from 19 December 2019 at www.hants.gov.uk/vehicle-registration-hwrc. For residents without internet access, please call 0300 555 1389 to register.

Help shape Hampshire's library service for the future

This County Council consultation has a deadline of the 18th March. Hampshire County Council is asking people who live, work and study in Hampshire to have their say on proposed changes to libraries. Please have your say: libraries are not just about borrowing books these days: maybe you use it for the internet? Reading the newspaper? This consultation includes options for a 15%, 20% or 25% cut in library opening hours. The way people use library services is changing, but as well as responding to changing needs, the library service is looking to make savings of £1.76 million. All services across the County Council are making cuts to bridge the current funding gap.

With some of the rural bus services offering just a few trips per day, could you benefit from the

Hants Carshare scheme? Hampshire runs its own liftshare scheme. Anyone can join for free: you need to register your email address or Facebook account. The more people who join and submit journeys, the greater chance of a liftshare match! Go to hants.gov.uk and search 'Hants Carshare'

Almost every day, I read reports of a flood or blocked road, faded white lines or pothole on Facebook or local email lists. Please report them online to www.hants.gov.uk, and follow the icon saying roads and transport. It will take you to a variety of options.
