## **Bedfield Lane Refuge**

By the time this newsletter is published, the new pedestrian refuge at the Springval Road end of Bedfield Lane should be completed. The photo below shows the men in the initial stages of the work.

The new refuge will make it much easier for local residents to cross, particularly our older residents from Headbourne Worthy House, and mothers with pushchairs and toddlers in tow. Parish Councillor Claire Welland, who worked hard to persuade the County that a refuge was necessary, said "I am delighted that the refuge is now becoming a reality".

## Barton Farm Forum - Reporting Back

Now that the new development at Barton Farm has planning approval - in outline - a Forum has been set up to bring together the views of Winchester City Council, Hampshire County Council, local parish representatives and the developers. Representing Headbourne Worthy Parish is Jane Rutter, who also represents Kings Worthy on the City Council.

"I am very aware of the potential impact of a



large increase in traffic on our villages, and will do all I can to ensure the planners and developers understand and mitigate that impact," said Jane. The first full meeting of the Forum is on 27th March. Members will also be visiting other similar sites elsewhere to inform design and other issues.

## New Parish Councillor

My husband and I lived in Luxembourg, where our children were born, for 7 years followed by 33 years in Brussels. I was a primary school teacher, first at the European School in Luxembourg and then at The British School in Brussels. ## Village Lengthsman Scheme

Nine villages in my division, including Headbourne Worthy, have signed up for the Lengthsman scheme, and we are now awaiting the approval of funding from the County Council. There is plenty to do at this time of year, clearing drains and leafy paths. The decision is expected soon: I will report back next month.

#### Adoption

## Highways Repairs

If the answer is 42, what was the question? It is the number of small items on the highways list that are still outstanding in the area after the winter. I went through the list with the officer at HCC last week! To make it worse, and because the weather has been so bad since last summer, Hampshire has had to authorise a number of works to be redone. Residents can report online or phone in faults on roads, pavements and footpaths on 0845 603 5633.

#### Local District Plan

The Local District Plan is moving on to the next stage (part 2). This starts to map out the uses for land, eg: to support green areas, leisure, employment, education, health, housing and shops and businesses.

There is an 'infrastructure wish list' associated with the plan. If you have any suggestions for your Parish, you should contact your Parish Council with your idea, who will review if it should go on the wish list. This can include village hall improvements, village greens, bike lanes, new play areas and footpaths.
