Electoral Commission Consultation

The Government's Electoral Commission has decreed that the number of councillors on Winchester City Council, and the ward boundaries, should be investigated with a view to bringing them into line with other neighbouring District Councils.

The City Council has already (on the casting vote of the Conservative Mayor) agreed to propose that the number of councillors be reduced from 57 to 45, and that all wards should be three member wards, instead of the current mix of one, two and three member wards, with elections three years out of every four, as at present.

Parish Councils and local residents are being invited to comment on the proposals,

and to make any suggestions as to how the new wards should be made up. At present, Headbourne Worthy is in a one member ward, with Crawley and Sparsholt. The boundary review means that Headbourne Worthy Parish could be moved back into a City Council ward with the rest of the Worthys, although the requirement for three members would mean that somewhere else would have to be included to make up the required number of electors - say South Wonston or Micheldever.

The Commission has said that in exceptional circumstances, and to better

War Memorial Restoration & Fund

LEST WE FORGET

Traditionally the Chair of the Parish Council places a wreath at the War Memorial on Remembrance Sunday; one of the things that did not occur as I was being persuaded to take the job was the realisation that this year marks the 100th anniversary of the outbreak, and that it would fall to me to mark this event.

The Memorial, in the grounds of St. Swithun's Church, was erected in the 1920's and has faithfully been the focus of remembering the sacrifices of two world wars and other conflicts. It is now time to repay that loyalty and to repair the damage of hot summers, wet winters and just anno domini. The PC is the proud custodian of the memorial, and in the forthcoming poignant four years it will put in place some repairs and refreshments that will enable it to continue the silent work it does. Initial



quotations indicate that this work will not come cheaply, or easily, as even planning permission has to be sought, so we will be launching, with the Church authorities, a joint fund raising and awareness initiative.

Why not join me in placing the wreath in this special year? My family is listed on the Thiepval memorial in France, and perhaps yours is also, so let us make this year's tradition a moving and memorable occasion. The service follows on from the wreath laying, at 11am, so why not join the congregation as well? You would be made most welcome.

Parish Lengthsman - Scheme Continues

Headbourne Worthy's Lengthsman, Craig Morris, works in the village for a day every couple of months. So far this year he has cleared footpaths, cut back nettles and branches from footpaths, picked up litter, cut the grass on the Watercress footpath, cleared out the gullies and culvert at the junction of Well House Lane and Down Farm Lane, and cleaned our village signs. This initiative is paid for by Hampshire County Council, and has been extended into 2015, so we will be seeing our Lengthsman working in the village for another year. Village Flora

You may have noticed the two areas of wildflower planting that went in this year. Headbourne Worthy paid for the plants, Phil Jeffs of Worthy Plants supervised the work, and the Worthys Conservation Volunteers planted them. You may also be thinking that it doesn't look like much at the moment, but fear not, the plants need to establish themselves, and next year the display will be even better.

As well as the summer display of the wildflowers, new Parish Councillor Tom Crutchfield has put together a plan for a Spring display around the village. Again, the Worthys Conservation Volunteers will be helping the Parish Council by planting bulbs in a few spots around the village as a start to this plan.

New Parish Councillor

Only six people put in nominations for the seven places on Headbourne Worthy Parish Council in May, when the four yearly elections for parish councillors were held. Thus we had no election, but the six were returned unopposed. Five members were returning councillors: Harry Whorwood (Chair), Christine Clarke-Smith (Vice-Chair), Claire Duncan, Claire Welland (Lengthsman coordinator)) and Jane Rutter (Newsletter). Flooding Update

Fingers crossed that we will not see a repeat of the flooding this winter, but as ground water levels are still extremely high, we are not being sanguine or complacent. A Flood Action Group has been formed, and a plan has evolved, so that what we learned can be used to forestall or mitigate another event. We have been working with the Environment Agency (EA) and Hampshire County and Winchester City Councils to identify what short-term self-help and simple mitigation or alleviation works can be carried out. It is hoped to have these in place as quickly as we can, before we move to more permanent solutions.

The whole of the Parish was affected; either by having to make tedious detours of the flooded areas, or more directly by water lapping at the front door. On this point, two important lessons have been learned; communication, and help. We did not have the ability to warn residents that

flooding was about to happen, and to keep them updated on the situation. We now receive advanced warnings from the EA, and we can keep you updated on what is happening; if you have given your email address to Adrian our Parish Clerk.

Help can come in various forms; wheelbarrows, tea making, evacuation, muscle or comfort and support. An efficient email system should be able to let residents know that help in whatever capacity is needed; not just for flooding, but in any emergency that might befall the village. Just as Neighbourhood Watch efficiently lets us know of crime threats to the village, the PC should warn of other threats or advise of help needs. We have asked Margaret Filley if we can share her email addresses, but if you would rather not let us share your email address, can you please confirm with Margaret before the end of October.
